- **Q. No. 2.** Analyze the political views and services of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan in the context of (20) Hindu-Muslim politics. What factors were responsible for his shift from Indian Nationalism to Muslim sub-nationalism?
- **Q. No. 3.** Why the Hindus were so vehemently opposed to the partition of the province of Bengal (20) in 1905? Discuss in length the Hindu agitation against the partition which finally resulted in its cancellation.
- Q. No. 4. "Though the Khilafat and Hijrat movements failed to achieve their immediate (20) objectives but they had great impacts on the lives of the Indian Muslims." Thoroughly analyze this statement and give arguments in support of your viewpoint.
- **Q. No. 5.** "The Nehru Report struck the last nail in the coffin of Hindu-Muslim Unity." Elucidate (20) the statement by giving those clauses of the Nehru Report which were unacceptable to the Indian Muslims and vehemently opposed by the Muslim leaders and Muslim political organizations.
- Q. No. 6. Write note on the elections of 1937 and the Muslim grievances under the Congress rule (20) in the provinces from July 1937 to October 1939.
- **Q. No. 7.** Give an account of the factors responsible for the delay in the drafting of the first (20) Constitution of Pakistan for nine years focusing on the differences between the political leadership of the East and West Pakistan.
- **Q. No. 8.** Discuss in length Pakistan's relations with the United States in historical perspective. (20) What future do you foresee for Pakistan's alliance with the United States in the ongoing Global War on Terror?
